WHY AM I BEING INVITED?

You were selected to represent thousands of others like you in England who were in Year 11 in 2020/2021, and you took part in the first wave of the survey in 2021 and the second wave in 2023. WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THE SURVEY?

This major survey is following over 5,000 young people across England over three waves to help us understand how education, well-being and careers support can be improved for young people such as yourself. We are about to start the third and final wave of the study. The questions will also collect demographic information such as your gender and family background.

WHAT WILL HAPPEN TO THE RESULTS OF THE SURVEY?

An anonymised version of the data (containing no information which identifies anybody who took part) will be given to researchers at King's College London for them to conduct the analysis of the survey. They will write up the results of the research in internal and published reports and academic publications, such as journal articles, conference papers and presentations in which it will be impossible to identify anybody who took part.
