#### THE SURVEY


We wanted to examine how young people experience their journey to life after school and why some young people have more similar (for better or worse) experiences than others.

#### 3 AREAS:


- What are young people's experiences of moving into further education or work?

We asked those who had an idea about what work they would like to do whether there was anything that might make it hard for them to achieve what they wanted to do.

- 47% said a lack of confidence in themselves.
- 47% said they might not get good enough grades.
- 23% said they were not sure how to achieve it.
- 22% said they might not have the right skills or personal qualities.
- 22% said they might not be able to access relevant work experience.
- 21% said there were not enough opportunities where they lived.
- 20% said financial barriers.
- 20% said they did not know anyone working in this area.
